

1844 Ship Alneas Glade up in the Curant

184 Days on Sunday February 4th
Commences with fine weather and light winds from E.S.E. heading S by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends Sunday
Lat 2° 00' N Long 151° 55' West

185 Monday Feb 5th
Commences with fine weather and light winds from E.S.E. heading S by the wind under all sail nothing in sight Middle & Latter Part fine weather and a strong breeze from E.S.E. heading S by the wind
Lat 3° 42' North Long 152° 33' West

186 Tuesday Feb 6th
Commences with fine weather and a fresh breeze from S.E. heading S by the wind under whole top sails and main top sail sent down main top galant mast and gaff and fore top galant yard at 4 P.M. took in bowsprit Middle Part squally at 2 P.M. pulled reefed the top sail Latter Part much the same so ends and hard times
Lat 5° 20' North Long 153° 35' West

187 Wednesday Feb 7th
Commences with fresh breezes from S.E. heading S by the wind under single reefed top sails at 4 P.M. sent in the fly jibboom and sent down the fore top galant mast and took in the mast boat Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends strong S.E. gales and fine weather
Lat 8° 35' North Long 154° 13' West

188 Thursday Feb 8th
Commences with fine weather and a fresh breeze from S.E. by E. ship heading S by W by the wind Middle & Latter Part much the same the watch employed in ships duty so ends nothing in sight
Lat 9° 10' North Long 154° 23' West

189 Friday Feb 9th
Commences with fine weather and fresh gales from E.S.E. heading S by the wind Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends
Lat 11° 15' N Long 154° 39' West

1844 Ship Alneas Towards the Sandwich Islands
190 Days out

Saturday Feb 10th Commences with fresh breezes from E.S.E. ship under whole fore and single reef main and main top sails and main top G. Sails. heading S by the wind. Middle and Latter Part the same all hands employed in their duty nothing in sight.
Lat 13° 30' North Long 155° 08' West

191 Sunday Feb 11th Commences with fresh breezes from E.N.E. ship under whole top sails and main top G. Sails. heading S by the wind middle & Latter Part much the same so ends nothing in sight
Lat 15° 35' North Long 155° 38' 31' West

192 Monday Feb 12th
Commences with fine weather and a fresh breeze from E.S.E. heading S steering by the wind under all sail middle Part squally single reefed the fore & main top sails Latter Part heavy squalls split the fore top sail on bent it and bent a new fore and main top sails and a new jib so ends bending new sails
Lat 17° 20' North Long 156° 05' West

193 Tuesday Feb 13th
Commences with squally weather wind from E.S.E. steering by the wind heading S at 4 P.M. bent a new main top sail and spanker doubled reefed the top sails and took in the jib Middle Part fresh breezes Latter Part light winds and calm so ends under all sail
Lat 19° 00' North Long 156° 09' West

194 Wednesday Feb 14th
Commences with slight winds and calm ship heading S by E under all sail Middle Part light breeze at 2 spoke the ship Gunany of say barlos 20 months out with 200 lbs of oil at 5 parted company Latter Part fine weather at 7 A.M. made the Island of Owhyhee bearing E dist 10 miles so ends with a light breeze steering for Mouee under all sail & ships in sight
