

1844 Ship Unca 234 Days out Port

Monday March 25th

Commences with thick rainy weather wind from S.W. ship heading N.E. & W. Middle Part wind calms to S. Latter Part much the same Course N.W. to End this day
Lat 28° 00 North Long 119° 58 East

235 Tuesday March 26th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from S.E. ship heading N.W. under all sail Middle Part calm latter Part light winds from S.E. to End this Day
Lat 28° 40 North Long 119° 09 East

236 Wednesday March 27th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from S.E. ship heading N.W. under all sail Middle & Latter Part fine breeze from the S ship heading N.E. & W to End
Lat 29° 42 North Long 128° 52 East

237 Thursday March 28th

Commences with fine weather wind from the S ship steering S.E. & W under all sail the watch Employed in ships duty Middle and Latter Part much the same to End
Lat 31° 13 North

238 Friday March 29th

Commences with thick foggy weather wind from the S ship heading S.E. & W under all sail Middle and Latter Part fresh breeze from the S and thick rainy weather to End this Day
Lat 33° 32 North

I must remark that Monday on the 25th of March our Captain called us in to the cabin and made a prayer for the first time and on Thursday night we had a prayer meeting in the cabin and if ever one was troubled in their mind I was I prayed night and day for the Lord to give me rest but I found ~~that~~ there was no peace for the wicked I found that I must give all up and serve him I shall be crossed out forever
