Ship under easy sail Employed in stowing
down oil middle Part fine weather Latter Part
thick and foggy Employed in boiling so Ends

Thursday June 20th

Commences with foggy weather
and light winds from E. ship heading S.E.
by the wind Employed in boiling middle and
Latter Part thick and rainy plenty of whales
in sight Employed in stowing down oil so Ends

323

Friday June 21st

Commences with thick rainy
weather wind from S.E. ship heading S.E.
by the wind under close reefed main top sail
middle and Latter Part thick and foggy so Ends

Lat 46° 05' N

Saturday June 22^d

Commences with thick fog
wind from E. and very light middle Part
much the same Latter Part thick and foggy
so Ends this day plenty of whales

Lat 45° 58' North Long 156° 49'

Sunday June 23^d

Commences with fine weather
and light winds from S.E. plenty of whales
in sight at 4 P.M. lowered the boats for
them the B.B. got fast and drained the
whale went off middle Part much the same
plenty of whales all round the ship Latter Part
fine weather so Ends this day

Monday June 24th

Commences with thick foggy weather
and light winds from S.W. ship heading S.W. by the
wind under easy sail middle and Latter Part
thick and foggy so Ends another day and got
nothing but all for the best

Tuesday June 25th

Commences with fine weather the fog
above off at 1 P.M. saw a whale lowered the boats
the B.B. got fast the B.B. got fast second boat
and got stove at 4 P.M. took the whale to the ship
and commenced cutting middle Part fine weather
Latter part much the same at 8 P.M. finished
cutting so Ends Lat 46° 03' North Long 156° 10'

Wednesday June 26th

Commences with fine weather and
plenty of whales lowered the boats for one the
B.B. struck one and killed him a look him to
the ship and cut him in middle Part much the
same Latter Part fresh breeze plenty of whales
lowered with out success so Ends the wind N.
Lat 45° 58' N Long 156° 18' East

Thursday June 27th

Commences with a fresh breeze from
S. ship under easy sail Employed in boiling
middle Part much the same Latter Part thick
and foggy plenty of whales in sight so Ends this day
Lat 45° 58' North

330

Friday June 28th

Commences with fine
weather and a fresh breeze from S. at 2 P.M.
lowered for whales the B.B. struck and the
line parted and away he went middle Part
much the same Latter Part fine weather saw
several whales so Ends Employed in boiling

331

Saturday June 29th

Commences with fine weather
and light winds saw whales lowered the boats
for them the B.B. struck one killed him and took
him to the ship and commenced cutting at dark
lashed down for the night middle Part much
the same Latter Part fine weather at 8 P.M.
commenced cutting at 10 finished so Ends Employed
in boiling and stowing down oil saw one whale
