Ship Unear fast in the fog

Sunday July 16th
Commences with thick dirty weather at 2 P.M. cleared up at 4 shut in thick one whale com a long side middle and latter Part much the same so ends

Monday July 17th
Commences with light winds and thick fog at 4 P.M. fell in with the ship master of New London 12 months out 2200 Middle and latter Part the much the same

Tuesday July 18th
Commences with thick fog and light winds from the W ship heading S by W middle and latter Part much the same
Lat 51° 00' North Long 158° 58' East

Wednesday July 19th
Commences with fresh breeze from E.S.E. ship heading S.E. under all sail. Middle Part thick and rainy latter Part much the same saw several hump backs
Lat 51° 30' Long 159° 32' East

Thursday July 20th
Commences with a fresh breeze from E by N ship heading E by E under double reefed top sails at 5 P.M. saw several right whales middle Part much the same latter Part blowing a gale from E by N ends saw 3 whales
Lat 51° 51' North Long

Friday July 21st
Commences with a gale from E by N at 2 P.M. wore ship to S.E. close reefed the top sails middle Part blowing heavy latter Part more moderate so ends this day
Long 160° 43' East

Saturday July 22nd
Commences with a fresh breeze from E more ship heading E.S.E. saw several right whales some going quick some very still but did not lower for them middle Part the same latter Part saw plenty of whales lowered for them but did not get fast saw a dead whale took him to the ship so ends this day

1844 Ship Unear fast to a blasted right whale

Sunday July 21st
Commences with fine weather and light winds Employed in cutting plenty of whales in sight lowered with out success middle Part much the same latter Part fine weather and light winds from I saw several whales lowered three boats the La B struck and the line parted so ends this day and got nothing
Lat 51° 50' N Long

Monday July 22nd
Commences with fine weather saw plenty of whales lowered three boats the B.B. struck one and the W.B. struck another hit their boats and took them to the ship one ship in sight middle Part much the same Employed in boiling latter Part fine weather Employed in cutting one sail in sight so ends

Tuesday July 23rd
Commences with fine weather and light winds from S at 2 P.M. spoke the ship farland of New Bedford 25 months out 800 lbs middle part much the same latter Part thick fog took one of the pots out and set another so ends the Capt very sick

Wednesday July 24th
Commences with fine weather and thick fog wind from S at 6 P.M. finished our try marks and commenced boiling middle Part much the same latter Part fine weather three sail in sight saw several whales going quick to the South so ends Employed in boiling
Lat 51° 51' N Long 161° 52' East

Thursday July 25th
Commences with fine weather and light winds from S.E. at 3 P.M. set in thick fog all hands Employed in storing down oil middle Part all the same latter Part foggy saw several whales going quick to the S.E. so ends Employed in boiling good night the watch is out and I am sleeping so away to bed you old fool
