

Ship Uncas now on hand

Thursday May 1st

Commences with calm and rainy at 2 P M saw whales lowered & boats the W Boat struck one kild him at 6 P M took the whale to the ship and set the watch middle part fresh breeze latter part blowing a gale from S E at 8 A M put the ship before the wind and hooked on for cutting the fluke rope parted and away he went hove a iron in to him and 11 A M got him a long side and let him lay raising very hard so ends with a whale along side

Friday May 2^d

Commences with bad weather wind came to N and blowing a screamer with a with a whale along side middle part more moderate latter part fine weather but a heavy swell running at 8 A M hooked on to the whale again got one lip and gave it up for a spell so ends boiling Latt 3 Long 151-12

Saturday May 3^d

Commences with fine weather at 11 P M ext commenced cutting again and at 6 P M finished middle part fine weather Employed in boiling latter part fresh breeze from S E at 10 A M blowing a screamer and raining all hands employed in boiling and stowing down oil at 11 wind came to N W and moderated so ends Long 151-27

Sunday May 4th

Commences with fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil and boiling at dark calm and plenty of whales in sight middle part fine weather latter part blowing fresh from S W ship under storm sails the watch Employed in boiling and stowing down so ends this day Latt 37-34 N Long 151-46 E

Now we go it with the decks full of oil and the lower hole full and between decks full of a little of every thing water bread shocks and gurry nee deape and we have got to put her through for day light and that is the way it

Monday May 5th

Commences with a gale from N W ship heading N N E under main top sail and foresail the watch Employed in boiling middle part much the same latter part more moderate all hands Employed in stowing down oil and boiling so ends Latt 37-32 N Long 151-58 E

Tuesday May 6th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from the N at 2 P M finished boiling at dark set the watch middle part much the same latter part fine weather and light winds from S S W ship heading W under all sail so ends stowing down oil Latt 37-41 N Long 152-02 E

Wednesday May 7th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from S S W ship under all sail stowing down oil and nothing in sight at 8 P M finished stowing down middle part much the same latter part fine weather wind S by E ship heading E by S under all sail all hands Employed in setting shocks and scraping bone so ends Latt 37-45 N Long 151-55 E

Thursday May 8th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from the S ship under all sail steering by the wind saw nothing middle part much the same latter part fine weather ship under all sail going to the westward saw seven hump backs so ends setting up shocks Latt 37-42 N Long 151-50 E

Friday May 9th

Commences with fine weather ship under all sail wind from S E at dark took in sail struck into green water middle part thick weather latter part blowing strong from S E and thick weather at 8 P M yard & right whale going quick the S W so ends thick fog and got no blubbers Latt 33-19 N Long 151-54 East
