Saturday July 19th
Commences with fine weather
and light winds from South steering S. under
all sail 2 ships in sight and plenty of sulphur
bottoms middle and latter part fine weather
1 ship in sight but no right whales at 12 M
spoke the ship Blouqua of New Bedford 10 E. 10 S
Lat 54. 30 North Long 162. 09

Sunday July 20th
Commences with fine weather
and light winds from East ship under all sail
steering S. 1 ship in sight middle and latter
part calm saw several fin backs 10 E. 10 S

Monday July 21st
Commences with fine
weather and calm home sick times no whales oh
how would not go a whaling let me get home once
more middle part much the same latter part fresh
breeze from S. E. ship heading S. E. 1/2 S under all
sail 10 E. 10 S

Tuesday July 22nd
Commences with a
gale from S. E. ship heading S. W. took in all
sail but lost reefed main top sail at 5 P. M. more
ship heading E. middle part blowing a squall
latter part blowing a gale and rainy 10 E. 10 S
No Ob.

Wednesday July 23rd
Commences with a gale from
S. ship heading E. by S. under close reefed main
top sail hauled 4 times and no mistak but all for
the best middle part more moderate latter part
light winds and foggy made all sail heading E. 10 E. 10 S
Long 161. 15 East

Thursday July 24th
Commences with light winds
from S. W. by S. ship steering E. 1/2 E. under
all sail saw plenty of hump backs but no right
whales middle and latter much the same
