

Friday Oct 3 1845

fore part light fins from N.E. steering
South middle and latter part light winds
at 3 AM came too aback headed to the west
at daylight steered S by W. Brava in sight
at 4 sent a boat on shore left some
letters. Lat 14 54

Saturday Oct 4th 1845

fore part light airs at 1 returned from
the shore steered out S.W. clear of the land
at 5 steered S by W middle and latter part
moderate and fine weather imployed
in various jobs about the ship
Lat 13 49 W
Long 24 00

Sunday Oct 5

fore part fresh breeze from from
N.E. at 7 AM squally steering South
mid squally much rain some thunder
variable winds in light sails steered
down to spails squally part set them again
at daylight fine weather set all sail
and hooped in sight So Ends
Lat 12 44 W
Long 23 39 W

Monday Oct 6

fore part moderate and fine
weather heading to the S.E. by the wind
mid and latter part mod and variable
very squally plenty of rain
down great number of sail
Lat 12 00 W
Long 23 00

Tuesday Oct 7 1845

fore part light winds from the
S.W. heading to the S.W. same sails in
sight steering to the S.W. mid and
latter part moderate winds from the
East at 4 AM took the Orientale June
from Calcutta for London So Ends
Lat 11 26 South
Long 24 00 West

Wednesday Oct 8

fore part light wind from the N.E.
steering South continues fine weather
and light wind from N.E. So Ends
Lat 09 41 W
Long 23 48 W

Thursday Oct 9

fore part light wind and squally
dunn rain calm S.E.
mid and latter part calm 2 ships
in sight So Ends Lat 9 44 W
Long 24 45 W

Friday Oct 10

calm at 5 a small breeze from
S.W. backed to the S.E. wind from N.W.
steered South Lat 8 54 W
Long 24 30 W

Saturday Oct 11th

all this day squally wind westerly
several sail in sight So Ends
Lat 7 50 South
Long 23 20 W
