part Moderate So Ends

main topsail and bent down & ends

Wednesday Jan 12th

fore part light winds from the East
middle fresh winds from SE steering
South latter the same So Ends

Long 40 " 09 W

Thursday Jan 13th

fore part fresh winds from
the NE at 8 PM saw two right
whales toward caught one took him
to the ship made him well fast

at middle and latter part strong
winds from the East at 8
bells commenced cutting at 8 finished
wore ship to the South under short sail

Lat 38 " 44 S

Long 40 " 25 W

Friday Jan 14th

fore part strong winds from the East
at 1 PM saw two right whales going quick
mid and latter part strong winds from
the NE & commenced sailing

Lat 39 " 24 S

Long 40 " 02 W

Saturday Jan 15th 1845

all this day strong winds from the NE
thick weather hailing at 4 saw a right
whale toward could not come up with him
at 10 AM finished hailing & ends

Lat 40 " 44 S

Sunday Jan 16th

fore part moderate steering to the West
some foggy at night in sail headed
to the NE middle moderate latter strong
winds from the West took in sail as
the wind breezed So Ends

Lat 41 " 04

Long 41 " 00

Monday Jan 17th

fore part strong winds from the West
headed South tubble reefed at night in
sail wore ship to the South same pinbacks
in sight middle strong winds from the
South latter strong gales So Ends

Lat 40 " 54 South

Long 43 " 15

Tuesday Jan 18th

fore part fresh winds from SE
inclining Easterly at night wore
ship to the South middle moderate at daylight
made she headed to the West wind SE
at 10 saw two right whales toward struck
one drew the frame came on board
up harts and in sail strong gales and
rain
