

Wednesday Nov 18th 1845
fore part strong winds from the west
heading west under short sail mid and
latter part moderate and thick fog
Lat 39 " 35

Thursday Nov 19th
fore part moderate and thick fog at
night in sail headed to the west mid
and latter part light winds and variable
thick fog
Lat 39 " 59 S

Friday Nov 20th
fore part light wind from SSW
thick fog mid and latter part moderate
winds from the south thick fog
at 5 AM saw a right whale
latter part light winds from the west
latter part light winds from the west
saw sperm whale going quick
Lat 39 " 44
Long 44 " 10
came on board took up
the boat thick fog the
remainder of the day

Saturday Nov 21st
fore part moderate thick weather
middle the same latter part more
clear at 8 AM ticked to the west
saw plenty of fishlocks at midday
saw right whale bowd caught and
Lat 39 " 40
Long 43 " 30

Sunday Nov 22nd
all this day moderate and some foggy
saw whales and chased got nothing
Lat 39 " 22
Long 43 " 02

Monday Nov 23rd 1845
all this day light winds and thick fog
employed hauling so ends

Tuesday Nov 24th
fore part moderate winds from the
north at 11 rain stopped the work and
took in sail middle strong latter heavy
gales from the SW trying headed to the west
so ends
Lat 39 " 01
Long 43 " 00

Wednesday Nov 25th
fore part heavy gales from
the SSW middle more moderate
latter part light winds from the west
saw sperm whale going quick
Lat 38 " 33 S
Long 41 " 40 west

Thursday Nov 26th
fore part fresh winds from the
north heading SSW at 4 PM saw sperm whale
bowd came on dark never saw the whale
again came on board and in sail from
the night at daylight made sail
fine weather so ends
Lat 39 " 15 S
Long 42 " 00 W

Friday Nov 27th
fore part light wind from south
middle the same saw two right
whales chased caught nothing
Lat 39 " 44 S
Long 42 " 10 W
