

Monday Dec 18th 1845
fore part light wind from NW
steaming SW all sail mid and latter part
light winds and calm plenty of fog
Lat 46° 19' 28"
Long 54° 00' 00"

Tuesday Dec 19th
fore part light winds and thick fog
steaming NW SW mid and latter part
moderate and thick fog. No Ah's
Long 56° 40' 00"

Wednesday Dec 20th
fore part moderate winds from
the East steaming NW SW thick fog
mid and latter part fine breezes from
the NE thick fog at 4 PM sounded 55 fath
No Ah's
Long 58° 10' 00"

Thursday Dec 21st
fore part fine breezes from the W
steaming South per compass mid and
latter part moderate Sun foggy. So End
Lat 46° 40'
Land in sight 30 miles
Long 62° 00' 00"

Friday Dec 22nd
fore part strong winds from the North
employed cutting middle and latter
part moderate at 10 AM saw one
right whale. toward caught him
Lat 44° 10'
Long 65° 00' 00"



Saturday Dec 23rd 1845
fore part strong winds from the
North employed cutting at 4 finished
barnard struck another whale run
to meridian far cut the line
mid strong winds from South heading
cut by the wind at 3 backed to the west
moderate at 10 saw whales toward struck
two saved them both So End Land in
sight 20 miles Lat 44° 45'
Long 50° 40' 00"

Sunday Dec 24th
fore part light winds from the NE
at 6 PM took the whales to the ship cut
one of them near ship off shore with
the other fresh winds from the North
at 5 commenced cutting at 8 finished
strong winds from the North foggy
hailing took the line

Monday Dec 25th
fore part fresh winds from the North
heading to the west under short sail
mid and latter fine weather saw plenty
whole barnard chased struck and took
the line Lat 47° 11'
Land in sight 20 mile East
Long 64° 00' 00"

Tuesday Dec 26th
fore part light airs at 6 struck
and saved a whale took him to
the ship made well fast at 5 commenced
cutting 9 finished moderate winds
saw whales and are sail steaming
Southward Lat 47° 55'
Land 16 miles off
