

Wednesday Dec 16 1845
fore part fresh winds from the W
hauled for whales without success
came on board took in sail employed
hauling middle strong winds from W
at 6 commenced stowing down
fine weather

Thursday Dec 17
fore part light winds and calm nothing
in sight employed hauling mid and
latter strong winds and calm stowing
down
Lat 47° 34' N
Land in sight 15 miles

Friday Dec 18
fore part equally variable wind
at 10 P.M. finished hauling middle and
latter part strong winds employed
strong stowing down so ended
Lat 47° 51' N

Saturday Dec 19
fore part moderate winds from
W at 6 finished stowing down
middle and latter part moderate and variable
calm so ended
Lat 47° 55' N

Sunday Dec 20
fore part calm fine weather nothing
in sight middle light winds from the
East steaming on W at 2 P.M. took a
gale from the South reefed the main
top sail hauled up the fore sail heading
to the West at 4 set the top sails at 4
double reefed
Lat 47° 57' N

Monday Dec 21 1845
fore part strong winds from the
South heading S by E the wind at 8 more
ship headed in shore at 8 in sail and
more ship off the land 6 miles off
middle strong winds at midnight strong
squalls from the south latter strong gales

Tuesday Dec 22
fore part strong winds from South
increasing to moderate and 15 miles dist
and and latter part moderate winds
from SW heading SE by the wind
Lat 47° 44' N
Long 65° 30' W

Wednesday Dec 23
fore part moderate and fine weather
mid and latter part calm on board the
presail repaired and bent again
Lat 48° 04' N
Long 65° 34' W

Thursday Dec 24
fore part moderate winds from the
South steaming S by E middle part
moderate and fine weather latter
strong winds and rain from East increasing
Southwesterly in S & E sails and double reefed

Friday Dec 25
fore fore part strong winds
from South rain at 4 more moderate
at mid reefs middle and latter part
fine weather wind westerly stowing
so ended
Lat 48° 49' N Long 65° 10' W
