 fore part strong winds from the West
 clearing S.E. mid and latter part
 the same do ends Lat 54° 15' S
 Long 65° 14' W

Saturday Dec 26
 fore part strong winds from west
 clearing S.W. at 8 calm at 8 took a breeze
 again mid and latter strong wind and
 calm at 3 AM the land in
 sight Staten land and Terra del

Sunday Dec 27
 fore part calm lying in the North
 part of the Straits at 3 PM took a
 signal from the South in all sail
 sails at 6 fine weather set the topsails
 at 6 tubble reefed heading W.S.W. at 11 PM
 calm at 2 PM took a breeze from W. and
 run through the Straits at midnight when
 I heard horn W.S.W. per compass 25 miles

Monday Dec 28
 fore part moderate wind from the W
 inclining to the South at 6 heading S.E.
 middle and latter variable and squally
 Lat 55° 14'

Tuesday Dec 29
 all this day variable and squally
 working to the S.W. cape horn in sight
 covered with snow Lat 55° 18'
 Long 65° 50'

Wednesday Dec 30 1845
 fore part strong winds and squally
 saw a big skid English caulker
 middle and latter part calm strong
 winds S.E. heading on the South
 western tack made and tacked
 sail as occasion required
 Lat 56° 47' S
 Long 67° 14' W

Thursday Jan 1 1846
 all this day fine weather winds from
 the West sun light squalls at
 9 PM saw a sperm whale
 around could not fasten
 Lat 58° 01' S
 Long 68° 24' W

Friday Jan 2
 fore part fresh winds from the
 S heading South by the wind
 middle strong winds from W. squally
 heading on S.W. at 3 wind S.W. tacked to the
 S.W. at 8 tacked to the S.W. fine weather
 Lat 58° 23' S
 Long 70° 00' W

Saturday Jan 3
 fore part fine weather wind westerly inclin-
 ing to the South at 8 tacked to the S.W.
 all sail out middle and latter part
 fresh winds from the W inclining
 to the North at 9 tacked to the S.W.
 Lat 59° 42' S
 Long 71° 24' W
