 fore part strong winds from the NW
 in sail as the wind began mid strong Gale
 close reefed topsails reefed courses at
 at 1 in mainsail at 6 wind off more
 to the North wind veering southerly heading
 off by 3 three ships in sight

Monday Jan 1846
 fore part fresh winds and high sea
 heading NW by E one ship in company
 at 8 PM backed to the SE wind and
 latter part strong Gale from the NW
 close reefed topsails and reefed courses

Tuesday Jan 1846
 fore part heavy Gale and squalls inclining
 to the SE at 4 more ships to the NW
 mid and latter part more moderate
 light high sea running heading NW
 by the wind saw a long straining whale

 Long 72° 56' W

Wednesday Jan 1846
 fore part strong winds from the NW
 at 1 PM backed to the SE double reefed
 topsails middle heavy winds close reefed
 topsails reefed foresail latter more moderate
 let out reef backed to the NW high sea
 running do ends

Long 70 Lat 54° 09' N

Thursday Jan 1846
 fore part a heavy Gale from SE
 Came on ending in all sail except
 close reefed topsails and reefed foresail
 run NW by W as long as safe at 3 PM
 in all sail home too head to the NW
 mid more moderate at 12 midnight
 set close reefed topsails reefed courses
 latter winds variable from the NW
 quarter lying close reefed and reefed foresail

Lat 56° 39' N

Long 76° 00' W

Friday Jan 1846
 fore part strong Gale and stormy
 weather back in and set close reefed
 fore topsail and reefed courses
 several times in the course of the 24
 hours

Lat 56° 35' N
 Long 76° 10' W

Saturday Jan 1846
 fore part heavy Gale from SE
 heading to the NW by the wind under
 close reefed topsails and double
 reefed courses mid more moderate
 let out reef as the wind left at 4
 all sail set at 9 light airs from
 the NW backed to the SE at 2 PM
 saw a hawk straining to the Eastward
 latter part moderate and fine weather
 heading SE by the wind
