Long 79° 34' W

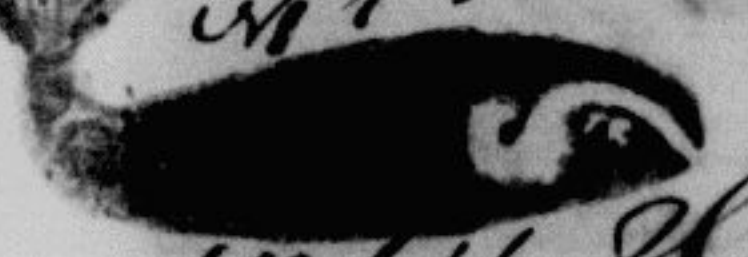
Wednesday Jan 14

at 6 passed the ship Gray of New York
at 11 PM spoke the California of Shumagin

Long 79° 40'

whale at 4 back him to the ship
at 7 finished cutting spoke the Sophia
of Braman no oil mid and later
part fresh winds from the North
employed hailing Lat 34° 55'
Long 79° 40'



Sunday Jan 18 1846
fine part strong winds from the
North saw whales all to the windward
at 6 toward for are going quick
came on board in sail and set
the mack middle strong winds from N. W
rain at 11 stopped hailing at 5 PM wind
shifted to the South at 4 commenced hailing
again strong winds so ends
Lat 34° 46'

Monday Jan 19
fine part strong winds from the South
employed hailing at 6 PM more to the
East Short sail mid at 8 later part moderate
and fine weather at 6 AM toward and struck
a whale and hit a line so ends
Lat 34° 57' S
Long 79° 20' W
