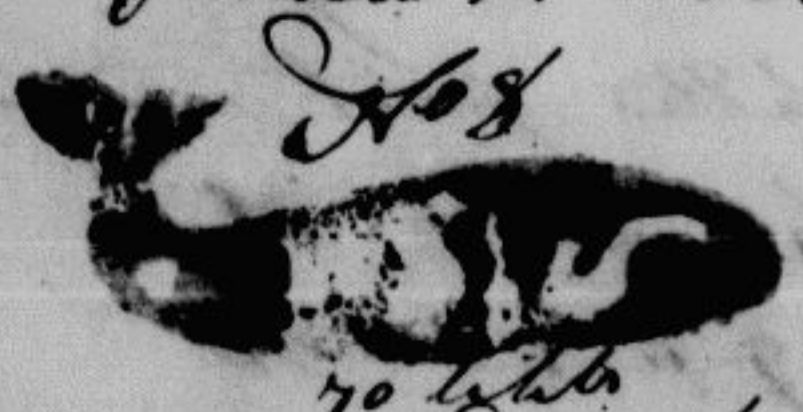


Tuesday Jan 10th 1866
fore part moderate and fine
weather at 1 struck a whale at
6 took him to the ship.

 made him well fast for
the night at 4 commenced
cutting at 7 finished, cleared
the decks began boiling so ends
Lat 44° 37'
Long 79° 30'

Wednesday Jan 11th
all this day moderate and fine weather
employed hauling no whales in sight
Lat 44° 30'

Thursday Jan 12th
fore part light winds from the NW
employed staining oil mid and latter
part moderate and calm employed
staining oil so ends Lat 44° 58' 28"
Long 79° 15' 24"

Friday Jan 13th
fore part fresh winds from the
NW heading to the NE Dubke reefed
the topails at 6 finished staining
in sail more ship to the west mid
and latter part strong winds from the
west head to the south at 10 tacked
ship to the north Lat 44° 55'
Long 79° 08'

Saturday Jan 14th
fore part fresh winds from the west
mid and latter part strong winds and squally
saw one whale but did not get him
heading to the NW wind at 4 PM saw and struck
a whale at 10 PM took him to the ship Lat 44° 00'
Long 81° 00'

Sunday Jan 15th 1866
fore part strong winds from the NW
employed cutting at 5 finished spoke the
Candar full for home mid and latter
part strong winds and squally rain stopped
the marks at 8 PM commenced again so ends
Lat 44° 58' 28"

 Monday Jan 16th
fore part strong winds from the NW
employed hauling mid and latter strong
winds and squally employed hauling
wind from the NW so ends
Lat 48° 05'
Long 81° 00'

Tuesday Jan 17th
fore part strong winds mid and more
moderate latter part calm fine
weather Lat 48° 09'
Long 81° 20'

Wednesday Jan 18th
fore part fine weather wind southerly
mid moderate latter fresh breezes
employed staining oil so ends
Lat 47° 48' 28"
Long 81° 34' 28"

 Thursday Jan 19th
fore part fine weather at 4 PM
struck a whale fast 10 minutes drew
the bow mid and latter fresh wind
from south spoke the James Steward
of St. James 120 lbs saw a ship cutting
at 10 finished staining Lat 47° 29'
Long 82° 00'
