fore part strong winds from south
at night in sail by head to the
latter part more moderate so ends
Lat 46 " 37
Long 81 " 45

Saturday Jan 31
all this day moderate and cloudy wind
from the south at 9 AM spoke the *Princess*
of 8 masted 3400 lbs likewise the *Edmond*
Carr of 8 masted 4 months out 200 lbs
Lat 45 " 01 38
Long 81 " 30 40

Sunday Jan Feb 1 1846
fore part light breeze from the
south mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather steering N by E
Lat 44 " 15
Long 81 " 50

Monday Feb 2
fore part light winds from the
south steering N by E all sail out
middle and latter part moderate winds
from the south
Lat 42 " 29
Long 81 " 20

Tuesday Feb 3 1846
fore part moderate and fine weather
spoke the *Flora* of 8 masted 9 months
out 2200 lbs bound home sent letters
to JC mid and latter part moderate and fine
weather cloudy repairing sails
Lat 40 " 50
Long 81 " 00

Wednesday Feb 4 1846
fore part moderate and fine weather
steering N by E per compass all sail trimmed
to the breeze employed repairing sails
blacksmithing &c mid and latter part
fine breeze from the south steering
N by E
Lat 38 " 58

Thursday Feb 5
fore part fresh breezes from the south
steering N by E per compass
nothing seen this day middle and latter
part fresh winds from the south steering
N by E employed repairing sails so ends
Lat 36 " 38 18
Long 80 33 40

Friday Feb 6
fore part fresh winds from the south
steering N by E per compass nothing seen
this day mid and latter fine weather
steering N by E so ends
Lat 34 " 31
Long 79 " 20

Saturday Feb 7
fore part fine weather at 1 PM
saw the *Isle of Juan Fernandez*
mid part fresh winds from south at
7 AM went on shore for water latter part
employed filling the raft and bus boats
fishing so ends
