

Saturday March 31st 1846
all this day fresh trades and equally
steering N by middle and latter part
the same. So Ends
Lat 19 " 50 N
Long 148 " 00 W

Sunday March 31st
fore part strong winds from
E & E by S equally steering N by
middle and latter part fresh winds
from the East & East So Ends
Lat 20 " 18 N
Long 150 " 33 W

Monday March 31st
fore part fresh winds from
E & E mid and latter part the same
So Ends
Lat 20 " 26 N

Tuesday March 31st
fore part fresh winds from E & E
at 3 Pm saw a whaler run down
off Taharano bay by for the night at
daylight stood in for Mamee Harbor
latter part light wind and variable
So Ends

Wednesday March 31st
fore part light winds and calm at
3 Pm sent the boats ahead to tow at
4 let go the anchor at Mamee
lay there until the next Friday morn
and then got under way marked
out or drifted there being but
very little wind this being
the 3^d day of April. J. C.

Saturday April 1st 1846
commences fine weather steering down
between Kanae & Moroto middle and
latter part fine weather off Waahoo
several ships in sight cleared out holding
Waahoo & Attai and so left the islands
for the E Coast

Sunday April 1st 1846
fine weather and fresh breezes steering
by the wind to the N by E mid and latter
part fresh winds from E & E the
Oregon in company So Ends
Lat 21 " 09 N

Monday April 2nd
all this day fresh winds from the
E & E steering to the N by E the Oregon
still in company So Ends
Lat 21 " 12 N

Tuesday April 2nd 1846
all this day fresh winds from the
E & E heading N by E by the wind imposed
pointing the boats the Oregon in company
So Ends
Lat 21 " 12 N

Wednesday April 3rd
all this day fresh winds from the
E & E heading by the wind to the N by E
two ships in sight So Ends
Lat 21 " 20 N
Long 160 " 29 W
