of seeing the same whale but no sign
him

Saturday April 11
fore part moderate and cloudy
saw two ships to leeward middle and
latter part strong winds and cloudy steering
to the South by the wind so ends this day
Lat 21° 15' N
Long 162° 28' W

Sunday April 11th
 fore part strong winds from E & E
 clearing to the North by the mid
 middle and latter part moderate and fine
 weather and no fish
 1833 - 27 cr
 Lang 163 - 00 W

Monday April th₁₃ 1856
Fore part moderate and fine weather
Saw two whales supposed to be fin backs
mid and latter part calm fine weather
when the mainsail repaired and went
again so end Lat 33° 38' Long 163° 00'

Tuesday April th 1846
 fore part calm and ship in light
 class blackish landward current at sunset
 mid and latter calm employed repairing
 sails
 Lat 23.29 N
 Long 164.00 W

Wednesday April th₁₄
 fore part calm light airs from
 the South - employed repairing sails
 mid and latter part moderate breeze from
 SSW steering ESE Sun Sun fin back
 Lat 34 " 33 N
 Long 163 " 20 W

Thursday April 16.
fore part fresh winds from the S.W.
leaving N.E. mid and latter moderate
winds from south cloudy do ends
Lat 36 " 03 N
Long 161 " 21 W

Friday April 18th
fore part fresh winds from South
at 4 PM wind shifted to the NW & raised
the yard headed to the NW by the wind
middle and latter part moderate winds
from the SE from the NW & heading East
by the NW at 8 PM backed to the NW
alt 36 " 27 & 28
Lat 15.9 " 16 " 16

Saturday April 18
fine part moderate and fine weather
wind from the East mild and calm
part moderate winds from South blowing and
no one ship.
Lat 38° 10' N
Long 155° 50' W
