

Monday April 19th 1846
Saw part moderate winds from
the the South Steaming & nothing
in sight mid and latter part moderate
wind from South Lat 39° 58'
Long 154° 40'

Tuesday April 20th
Saw part moderate winds from the
South Steaming & nothing seen but
saw backs middle and latter part fresh wind
at 4 PM wind shifted from South to E by S
heading E by the wind Lat 41° 50' W
Long 154° 50' W

Wednesday April 21st
Saw part fresh winds from the West
heading to the North mid and latter part
fine breezes and fine weather
rather cool Lat 43° 41' W
Long 152° 38' W

Thursday April 22nd
Saw part fine weather and
cool nothing in sight middle
fresh winds cloudy latter part the same
Lat 45° 50'
Long 152° 20'

Friday April 23rd
Saw part strong winds from South
at 6 PM in all sail but close reefed
Main topsail and foresail Steaming
E by N at 10 PM in foresail brought the
ship too head to the N latter part heavy gale
and had sea running do end
Lat 47° 15' W
Long 151° 40' W

Saturday April 24th 1846
all this day heavy gales from South to
SW heavy squalls and very bad sea
laying head to the W Close reefed main
topsail main & foresail fore & main stay
sail loose some times and plenty of
rain and leaky hatches Lat 48° 50'
Long 151° 15'

Sunday April 25th
Saw part heavy gales from South
to SW laying on the Western track
with the same sail out as above
and no signs of better weather this
is the SW where there is no gale
of wind middle and latter part heavy
gale and squalls do end Lat 48° 04'
Long 150° 00'

Monday April 26th
all this day heavy gales from SW
laying head to the SW all sail in
Lat 48° 31' W
Long 150° 30' W

Tuesday April 27th
Saw part strong gales from SW
middle and latter part more moderate
sun rain and fog do end Lat 48° 45'
Long 149° 50'

Wednesday April 28th
Saw part calm sun snow and thick
weather middle fresh winds from SW
latter part strong winds from the West
at daylight set double reefed topsails
heading North by the wind Lat 49° 09' W
Long 149° 00' W
