all this day fresh winds from equally
at 4 PM hauled for whale could not
fasten back in sail for the night at
daylight made sail at 10 hauled for a
right whale going quick to the mind
no came up

Friday May 12th
fore part strong breeze from the S.E.
hauled to the S.W. at 4 hauled for a right whale
no got him middle fine weather
at 9 AM whales hauled caught one
at Maricao took him to the ship
upon the ship

Saturday May 13th
fore part good weather. Wind from
South cutting at 6 finished mid and latter
squall employed hauling one ship
in sight so ends

Long 148° 10' W

Sunday May 14th
fore part strong wind from the
East sun rain hailing mid
and latter part strong gales from
the S.E. ten greater rain so ends

Lat 53° 02' N
Long 147 46 W

Monday May 15th 1846
fore part strong winds foggy mid and
latter light air from East thick fog
employed hauling

Lat 52° 50' N
Long 147 30 W

Tuesday May 16th
fore part strong winds from S.E. rain
at 9 PM finished hauling mid and
latter part strong gales from the S.E.
at 4 commenced stowing down oil
at 10 AM wind shifted to the S.E.

Lat 52° 41' N
Long 147 40 W

Wednesday May 17th
fore part strong gales from the S.E.
light sea running mid and latter part
strong winds from the S.W. stowing oil

Lat 52° 25' N
Long 148 30 W

Thursday May 18th
fore part strong winds from the
S.W. two ships in sight employed
shifting up hooks at 10 PM saw a right
whale hauled drove him off mid and
latter part moderate winds and calm

Lat 52° 01' N
Long 149 50 W

Friday May 19th
fore part strong calm at 3 a light breeze
from S.E. at 4 in sail for the night
mid and latter part fresh winds from South

Lat 52° 20' N
Long 150 00 W
