 Lat 52° 05'

Tuesday June 16th
 all this day fine weather same
 foggy plenty of ships several whale
 going quick land without
 success Lat 52° 04'

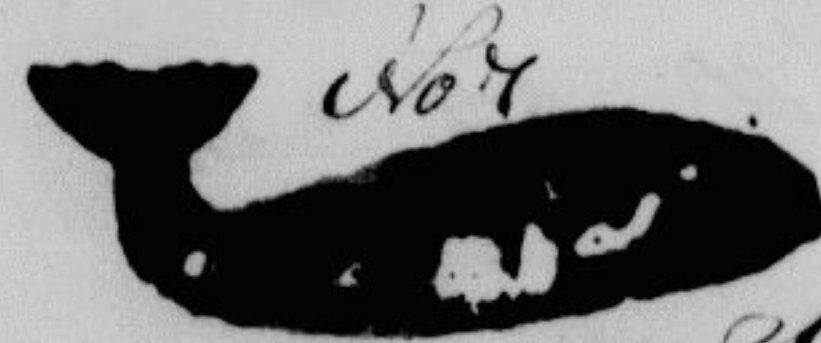
Wednesday June 17th
 all this day fresh winds saw whales
 chased got nothing so ends.
 Lat 52° 00'

Thursday June 18th 1846
 all this day fresh breezes and fine
 weather saw whales very wild showing
 rib and hoiling saw a number of
 ships at midnight Lat 52° 10'

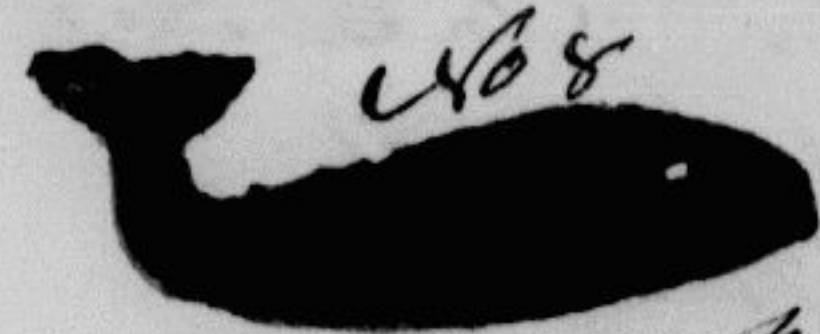


Friday June 19th
 all this day fresh winds from the
 west cutting and chasing whales
 Lat 52° 01'

Saturday June 20th
 fine weather chasing mid whales
 at midnight succeeded in taking
 one to the ship winds southerly
 Lat 52° 11'



Sunday June 21st
 Strong winds more ship with
 the whale commenced cutting at 6
 finished more ship again in
 all sail layed fast to the ship
 strong gails and rain latter more
 moderate commenced showing oil
 at 9 set the marks to going
 Lat 52° 16'



Monday June 22nd
 foggy fresh winds caught a whale
 at 1 PM took him to the ship at
 1 PM saw a ship strike a whale near
 the ship at 4 commenced cutting so ends
 Lat
