Tuesday Oct 13
 fore strong winds from the West at
 midnight more ship to the SE at night
 in day nothing seen yet mid and
 latter part strong gales from the
 West heading to the SE at 6 PM
 more ship to the North and back
 in sight wind inclining to the
 South heading NW clost reefed
 main & sail and reefed foresail
 Lat 42° 18' S
 Long 77° 00' W

Wednesday Oct 14
 fore part strong gales from NW
 heading NW at 6 PM spoke the bark
 The Harb of Stonington mid and
 latter part strong gales from the West
 and heavy squalls split the foresail
 and bent a new one clost
 reefed the fore topsail and set it
 No Obs

Thursday Oct 15
 fore part strong gales and heavy
 squalls from the West boat slight
 back in the boat last middle strong
 gales more ship at 4 PM wind started to the
 headed off NW inclining to moderate
 at daylight steered NW & E Lat 40° 47'

Friday Oct 16 1846
 all this day strong winds from SE
 steering NW under clost reefed
 3d sails
 Lat 39° 49' S
 Long 76° 30' W

Saturday Oct 17
 all this day strong gales from south
 exchanged signals with the stars
 on ship Bedford at 9 AM spoke
 the same ship 300 lbs 35 months
 wind South more moderate
 Lat 39° 30' S
 Long 76° 20' W

Sunday Oct 18
 all this day moderate winds from
 South heading to the SE & E
 Lat 39° 24' S
 Long 77° 20' S

Monday Oct 19
 fore part light airs from South
 at 1 PM spoke the steamer
 of New Bedford 300 lbs 35 months
 latter part light winds at midnight
 backed to the SE & E nothing
 seen in all this time mid and
 latter part moderate winds from
 from South
 Lat

Tuesday Oct 20
 fore part calm at midnight back
 a breeze from South latter fresh
 fresh winds heading to the SE
 Lat 39° 30' S
 Long 77° 40' W
