Thursday Jan 19
Strong winds from West saw whales
and saw caught nothing at 6 PM
to 10 AM 40 ships in sight at one

lat 43° 14'

Friday Jan 20
Strong wind from NW heading to the
South West hailing several ships in
at 6 stopped hailing rain middle
and latter part more moderate hailing
at midnight finished strong wind and
rain so ends lat 43° 11'
long 76° 20'

Saturday Jan 21
Strong winds from NW heading to
the SW at 6 spoke the America of
New Bedford 18 months ago lbs
and strong Gale from North hailing
head to the other heavy squalls of wind
and rain so at 4 PM called all hands
turned up the boats took in the hamm
boat high sea running so ends
lat 44° 15'
long 77° 05'

Sunday Jan 22 18/6
heavy Gale from the West heading to
the South mid strong Gale at 9 more
ships at 9 more again commenced
staring Cb. strong squalls so ends
lat 44° 03'
long 77° 08'

Monday Jan 23
fore part strong Gale from NW
at 4 PM finished staring down rapid
fore sail lay headed to the W at 2 mid
changed to the W at 4 AM wind to the
South more to the West lat 44° 51'
long 77° 40'

Tuesday Jan 24
fore part strong Gale from the South
inclining to the moderate two ships
in sight mid am later fine weather
saw two whales lower no get him
lat 44° 12'
long 77° 40'

Wednesday Jan 25
fore part strong winds from
the NW spoke the Lydia of Falmouth
Haver 18 months ago lbs saw some
right whales middle strong winds
from NW thick weather at 5 set the
tops double reefed at 10 took them in
again rain so ends lat
long 77° 40'
