saw two whales to windward not
fasten

Sunday Dec 9th
fore part fine weather mid from
south at 3 toward for a whale and
caught him at 4 took him to the
ship at 8 finished cutting and
in sail mid and latter part
fresh breezes employed boiling

Monday Dec 10th
all the day moderate winds from
the W foggy Spake the mile at
even Bedford 1 manths 150 saw
whales toward no got him
Latt 45th 18th
Long 78th 25th

Tuesday Dec 8th 1846
fore part moderate winds from W
some foggy saw whales and heard
got nothing mid and latter strong winds
and thick weather employed staving
oil
Latt 45th 25th
Long 78th 30th

Wednesday Dec 9th
fore part strong winds from W
thick weather at 4 finished staving
middle more moderate latter fine
weather at 8 AM toward and caught a
whale got one boat stitely slow and
capsized at 11 took the whale to the
ship
Latt 45th 38th
Long 78th 38th

Thursday Dec 10th
fore part fine weather mid
to the West small breeze at 4
finished cutting. Cleaned the decks and
got the water mid and latter part
moderate and fine weather at 10 toward
for whales at 11 fasten one at 2 PM
took him to the ship Latt 45th 19th
Long 79th 00th

Friday Dec 11th
fore part fine weather employed
cutting at 6 finished set the
water mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather employed hauling
and setting up shooks
Latt 45th 43th
Long 78th 15th
