 fine weather employed hailing
 and setting up 18 hooks lat 45° 23'
 long 78° 10' 20"

Sunday Dec 13
 fore part fine weather employed
 storming oil between decks mid and
 latter part fine weather General
 ships in sight and a few whales
 lat 45° 38'
 long 78° 00'

Monday Dec 14
 fore part moderate and fine
 weather winds from SW saw
 a plenty of ships stirring and
 a few whales and then very little
 spoke the Rutledge of Greenock
 lat 45° 31'
 long 79° 10'

Tuesday Dec 15
 fore part fine weather saw whales
 and chased got nothing middle and
 latter part the same no whale yet
 lat 45° 30'
 long 79° 00'

Wednesday Dec 16
 fore part fine weather chasing mid
 whales and getting nothing spoke the
 Callaghan of Manhattan 7 miles
 lat 45° 12'
 long 79° 30'

Thursday Dec 17 1846
 fore part moderate and fine weather
 mid and latter calm saw one whale
 hauled and drew him off saw the
 General Scott take a whale
~~lat 45° 15'~~
 long 79° 40'

Friday Dec 18
 fore part moderate and fine weather
 winds from the south foggy saw
 the Cinsanetta take a whale
 I hope it will come my turn
 soon saw but very few
 whales mid and latter part strong
 breeze same foggy saw whales
 chased got nothing lat 46° 57'
 long 78° 50'

Saturday Dec 19
 fore part moderate foggy saw
 one whale caught him after a
 long chase of 4 hours took him
 to the ship at 9 PM commenced
 cutting at 1 AM at 6 PM finished
 spoke the Roscoe 37 months past
 lat 46° 57'
 long 78° 30'

Sunday Dec 20
 fore part moderate winds from SW
 saw foggy at 2 PM caught a whale
 took him to the ship at 3 and hauled
 in and set the match at 4 AM commenced
 hailing 10 cords lat 47° 05'
 long 78° 30'
