 fore part strong winds from
 SW employed starting oil
 middle strong winds and sail
 latter part fine weather saw
 whales and chased caught nothing
 Lat 47° 19'
 Long 78° 00'

Thursday Dec 24
 fore part strong winds from
 the SW saw whales and chased
 caught nothing plenty of ship
 middle and latter strong winds
 and squally sea rain
 Lat 47° 30'

Friday Dec 25 1846
 fore part strong gales from the NW
 employed starting head and starting
 the sails aft in the new pen the head
 in three place mid and latter strong
 winds and squally spoke the exger
 29 man the 3000 shes
 Lat 47° 30'

Saturday Dec 26
 fore part strong gales from the NW
 laying head to the SW middle and
 latter part the same
 Lat 48°

Sunday Dec 27
 fore part strong gale from
 NW heavy squalls mid and latter
 heavy gale from the NW heavy
 squalls
 Lat 48° 15'
 Long 78° 00'

Monday Dec 28
 fore part heavy gale from the NW
 set the foresail reefed more to the
 NW high sea running at 6 PM
 let the reef set the foresail inclining
 to moderate middle strong winds
 heading cross latter strong winds from
 NW heading SW by W double reefed
 employed starting oil to ends
 Lat 47° 57'
 Long 77° 40'
