fore part strong gales from  
the north rain at 2 Pm finished  
staying and in sail heaving  
SW by W 8 ships in sight mid part  
heavy gale from SW at 1 Pm in  
fore sail and turned up the lee boat  
latter part moderate made sail at  
9 Pm employed taking a broken pit  
from the masts and sitting a man  
and in its place do end

Wednesday Dec 12<sup>th</sup>  
fore part fresh breezes from the  
west cloudy took a whale to the ship  
and found him not worth cutting  
and let him go again mid and latter  
part moderate breezes from the SW  
saw the Ches Phelps of Stonington  
30 months ago

Long 77° 56'

Thursday Dec 13<sup>th</sup>  
all the day fine moderate weather  
nothing in sight but ships do end

Friday Jan 1<sup>st</sup> 1847  
fore part fresh breezes from the  
north west heading of SW 8 ships in  
sight doing the same mid and latter  
latter strong winds from the west  
do end

Lat 47° 17'

Saturday Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> 1847  
fore part strong gales from the  
NW equally heading to the west  
spoke the Martha of Fairhaven  
the Martha 300 bbls middle and latter  
strong gales

Lat 47° 57'  
Long 78° 00'

Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>  
fore part strong winds from  
the west clear weather heading  
to the west several ships in  
sight mid and latter part strong  
gales from SW same rain do end

Monday Jan 4<sup>th</sup>  
fore part strong gales from SW  
heading SW about reefed main & sail  
and fore sail mid and latter part  
strong gales from SW thick weather  
one ship in sight and one bark

Lat 48° 36' S

Tuesday Jan 5<sup>th</sup>  
fore part strong gales from  
north thick weather Barometer  
falling in fore boat and reefed  
the fore sail mid and latter part  
heavy gales from west at morning  
about reefed the fore main & sail  
in fore sail
