fore part heavy gales from North
West mid more moderate wind
headed to the N more to the East
at 4 made sail at 8 split fore topsail
anchor repaired and hauled again
So Ends 40 kts

Monday Jan 25
fore part fresh winds from
N & N. W. some squally steering
North mid and latter part
fresh winds from South spoke the
Planter of San Juan all full
hauled home. the island of
Morcho in sight

Tuesday Jan 26
fore part strong winds from
South saw plenty of Sulphur bottom
and some blackfish spoke the
Hypocrite of San Juan. Mantana
of San Juan the island 10 miles

Wednesday Jan 27
all this day fine weather in com
with ship Mantana 40 miles
from the land Lat 38° 17'
plenty blackfish

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Thursday Jan 28 1847
fore part moderate winds from
South in camp with ship Mantana
at 4 PM saw one sperm whale
and her boat struck him into and
back to the ship at 8 PM mid and
latter part strong winds from South
heading off in a little needed
Lat 38° 02'

Friday Jan 29
fore part strong gales from South
heading to the ESE at 10 in fore topsail
and hauled up for the day in haps
of tomorrow mid and latter part strong
gales from South laying off on So Ends
Lat 38° 14'

Saturday Jan 30
fore part heavy gales from South
saw several ships running in the direction
laying head to the SW double reefed main
st. sail and fore sail mid and latter part
heavy gales from South at maximum
calm Lat 38° 55'

Sunday Jan 31
fore part calm heavy swell nothing
in sight mid and latter part moderate
and some squally thunder and lightning
chased a humpback So Ends Lat 37° 49'

Monday Feb 1st
fore part moderate and cloudy weather wind from NE at 7 in
sail head to the NW mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather winds from the East
Lat 37° 08'
