fore part strong Gale from
South especially lay head to the West
mid and latter part Gale from South
Lat 35° 33'
Long 57 20

Friday Jan 30
all this day strong Gale from
the South heading W by N by the
wind double reefed Lat 35° 14'
Long 57 11

Saturday Jan 31
fore part fine winds at 4 calm
mid and latter fine weather
Lat 35° 40'
Long 58 40

Sunday Feb 1st
fore part fresh winds from
the NW headed to the SE at
6 saw Spinner whales around
caught one slave and boat
at Manzanilla took the whale to
the ship Lat 35° 35'
Long 57 30

Monday Feb 2nd 1852
fore part fine weather cutting
took the body in and made
the head fast for the night at
day light back in the hole began
boiling Lat 35° 58'
Long 57 40

Tuesday Feb 3rd 1852
fore part fine weather spoke
the Constitution 15 months 600
best letters home by her mid
and latter fresh winds from
North sailing Lat 35° 18'
Long 49 19

Wednesday Feb 4th
strong winds from North
mid and latter the same nothing
saw but sails Lat 35° 42'
Long 48 40

Thursday Feb 5th 1852
fore part strong winds from
North headed to the NW and short
sails mid and latter part fresh winds
from NW at 6 more ship to the SE
so ends Lat 35° 37 S
Long 49 46 11

Friday Feb 6th 1852
fore part fine weather wind
from NW headed to the SE at night in
sails smoke and thick weather
had sailing mid and latter part
fresh winds blowing off in the
main track Lat 34° 41'
Long 49 50

Saturday Feb 7th 1852
all this day thick weather
and moderate spoke the
Gray Hawk of West Port
Lat 34° 18 Long 49 00
