Monday Feb. 8th 1852
 fore part fresh winds and squally
 same rain at night in sail head
 to the WSW mid & C mid and
 latter part strong winds from
 WSW head to the SW by the double
 reefed
 Lat 35° 09'
 Long 51° 18'

Tuesday Feb. 9th 1852
 fore part moderate squally
 same thunder in all sail
 barometer falling mid heavy gale
 from South latter the same
 at 10 AM wind hauled to the WSW
 more to the SE so end Lat 36° 09'
 Long 52° 11'

Wednesday Feb. 10th
 fore part strong gale from
 WSW inclining to moderate at
 4 PM set the main top sail & coast
 reefed middle moderate calm midnight
 wind SW more to the SE
 Lat 36° 38'
 Long 51° 20'

Thursday Feb. 11th 1852
 commences strong gale from SW
 head to the SE short sail at night more
 moderate mid more moderate
 latter fresh winds from the East
 Lat 36° 36'
 Long 51° 45'

Friday Feb. 12th 1852
 fore part strong winds from SW
 at night in sail mid and latter part
 moderate and fine weather clothing
 down sent down the fore top
 Gallant Mast and rigging
 Lat 36° 09'
 Long 52° 00'

Saturday Feb. 13th
 fore part moderate fine weather
 wind from SE no whales yet mid
 and latter part strong gale from the
 South
 Lat 36° 42'
 Long 51° 50'

Sunday Feb. 14th
 fore part strong gale from
 South mid and latter more moderate
 steering to the SE
 Lat 35° 33'
 Long 50° 55'

Monday Feb. 15th 1852
 fore part moderate winds heavy swell
 mid and latter strong winds from SE
 Lat 36° 04'
 Long 49° 52'
