the ESE impleys steaming oil in the
main hatch at night. Sail ho'd to
the ESE mid and latter part strong
wind from the East.

Friday Feb. 27
Commenced with strong winds from
the ESE thick same rain mid and
latter part strong gales from ESE
laying head to the East.

Saturday Feb. 28
all this day heavy gales from
East thick and hazy do ends

Sunday Feb. 29
all this day strong gales from
East thick and squally laying head
to the East. No sail out
do ends

Monday March 1st
Lat 33 " 40
Long 16 " 55

Tuesday March 2nd
Lat 33 " 49
Long 16 " 41
Sounded the current
singing to the ESE
10 miles per day

Wednesday March 3rd 1852
light winds and high swell
Lat 33 28
Long 17 52

Thursday March 4th
Strong winds southerly
latter moderate Lat 33 20
Long 17 50

Friday March 5th
all this day light winds and
variable Lat 34 " 10
Long 17 00

Saturday March 6th
fresh winds and fine weather
steaming to the SW Lat 35 00
Long 18 00

Sunday March 7th
fresh winds from North mid
squally thunder same rain latter
fine weather steaming SW by S

Lat 36 24 N
Long 18 36 W

Monday March 8th
fine fine weather light airs from
North mid fresh winds from
North at midnight squally wind SW
and rain wind back to ESE
do ends Lat 38 16
Long 19 20
