Wednesday March 8th
 Lose part strong winds from
 the W at night in sail head to the S.W.
 mid strong Gale from W.S.W. at 5 in
 foresail at 6 in main & sail have
 tag head to the W.S.W. So Ends
 Lat 41 " 03
 Long 53 " 52

Thursday March 9th
 Commences strong Gale from W.S.W.
 inclining to moderate at 4 Set main
 & sail and foresail mid strong gale
 from West headed to the South
 Lat 41 " 35
 Long 54 " 05

Friday March 10th
 all this day strong Gales from
 West headed to the S. So Ends
 Lat 42 " 14
 Long 54 " 00

Saturday March 11th
 Commence heavy Gale from South
 head to the W. mid and latter part
 moderate Calm
 Lat 43 " 11
 Long 55 " 30

Sunday March 11th 1852
 Commences with strong breezes
 from the West inclining to the South
 tacked to the W at meridian.
 Lat 43 " 54
 Long 56 " 31

Monday March 12th
 Calm fine weather at night
 saw sperm whale a large lot of
 large whales to late to leave run
 off as they were headed in hope
 of tomorrow but saw no more
 of them.
 Lat 43 " 58
 Long 55 " 59

Tuesday March 13th
 Commences with fresh winds
 from the W fine weather mid
 and latter part moderate calm
 some fog
 Lat 43 " 38
 Long 56 " 00

Wednesday March 14th
 Lose part Calm at 1/2 fresh breeze
 from South head to the West at
 night in sail mid fresh winds
 from South latter squally thunder-
 & latter strong winds foggy So Ends
 Lat 43 " 51
 Long 57 " 50

Thursday March 15th
 moderate winds from South
 steaming in to the West bounded
 in 60 fathoms
 Lat 43 " 32
 Long 59 " 30
