to moderate at 4 PM set fore top sail double
reefed mid fine weather latter fresh winds
from NW heading obliquely the wind

Tuesday March 30th
Commences strong winds from the North
heading Easterly mid strong gales from
the North at midnight wore ship to
the SE in main top sail at 4 PM mid
shifted to the SW strong gales So Ends
Lat 44.03

Wednesday March 31st
Commences strong gales from the North
head on SE mid more moderate
daylight set double reefed top sails
So Ends

Thursday April 1st
Strong winds from the North
at night in sail head to the North

Long 56.16

Friday April 2nd 1852
Fine part moderate smokes nothing
seen at night in sail head to the NE
wind Southerly mid and latter part fine
weather wind Northerly Steaming to the N
at ten in the ship Steamed SSE

Lat 44.21
Long 56.54

Saturday April 3rd
Commences strong winds from North
at night in sail head to the N mid
strong winds from North latter light airs
and calm
Lat 44.35
Long 57.00

Sunday April 4th
Commences moderate wind from the
SE same thick toward the heat and
short same birds for boat mid fresh wind
from the North latter part foggy
Lat 44.06
again the ship

Monday April 5th
Commences fresh winds from the North
heading to the West by the wind mid and
latter part moderate fine weather
wind Southerly same fresh breezes
Lat 44.11
53 fathoms water

Tuesday April 6th
all these 24 hours moderate same
foggy and same clear weather
nothing in sight Lat 42.30
again the ship
