

Wednesday April 7th 1842
Commences strong winds from South
heading NW at night in sail head to
the NE nothing seen yet mid and
latter part strong winds from South
at midnight wind from the NE sharp
lightning so ends
Lat 44° 32'
Long 57° 34'

Thursday April 8th
Commences moderate and fine weather
head to the NW mid fine weather
calm latter fresh winds from the NW
at 10 saw one right whale toward chase
Lat 42° 07'
Long 48 fathoms

Friday April 9th
Saw part fresh winds from the NW
at 9 saw two right whales toward chase
not fasten the cables very slow
at night in sail head to the NW mid and
latter moderate calm caught plenty
of fish
Lat 41° 04'
Long 51 fathoms

Saturday April 10th
Saw part fresh winds from South
at strong gales took in all sail head to the
west saw nothing this day mid
fine weather latter strong winds from
the NW
Lat 41° 06'
Long 45 fathoms

Saturday April 11th
Commences with strong gales from
the NW strong SE until 4 PM in
all sail head to the NE saw a Brig sailing
to the NE mid strong gales from the NW
at daylight wind changed to the more moderate
at 10 saw two right whales at 9 in all sail
head to the blowing heavy from South

Sunday April 12th
All this day heavy gales from the South
head to the west so ends
Lat 40° 57'

Monday April 13th
Commences heavy gales from South
inclining to moderate at 1 PM in
all sail and foresail mid and latter part
moderate high swell head to the west
Lat 40° 34'

Tuesday April 14th
Commences strong winds from the
South high swell at 1 PM more
to the NE at night in sail head to the
NE barometer falling
mid and latter part strong winds from
the North NW
Lat 39° 54'
Long 54° 11'

Wednesday April 15th
Commences strong winds from the
NW strong SE at night in main sail
at 10 saw two right whales mid and latter fresh
wind from the NW inclining South by
Lat 38° 34'
Long 55° 30'
