Monday Dec 21. 1854  
fore part fine weather winds  
from SW steering SW same ship  
in light mid and latter part fresh  
breezes from SE steering SW same  
sail in light fine weather do ends

Tuesday Dec 22. 1854  
commences fine weather steering  
SW all sail triced to the breeze  
employed in various jobs in getting  
ready for whaling &c. mid and latter  
part strong winds from NE  
steering SW do ends

Lat 24. 56  
Long 88. 48

Wednesday Dec 23. 1854  
fore part strong winds from  
SE steering SW nothing in  
light mid and latter part some  
rain at 10 AM wind from SE  
do ends No Whales

Thursday Dec 24. 1854  
strong winds and squally  
attended with rain steering  
SW mid and latter strong  
winds from SE sailing

Lat 28. 26  
Long 85. 12

Station Dec 20. 1854

Friday Dec 25. 1854  
fore part strong winds from the  
SE cloudy same rain steered  
SW under the top sails mid and latter  
part moderate fine weather steering  
SW all sail triced. Lat 30. 20  
Long 87. 48

Saturday  
Sunday Dec 26. 1854  
fine weather winds from SW at  
4 PM steered SW by S. all sail drawn  
mid and latter part fine weather  
wind from the East. Lat 31. 42  
Long 89. 28

Monday Dec 27. 1854  
commences with fine weather wind  
from NE middle fine latter rain  
wind East inclining to the South  
Lat 33. 20 S  
Long 90. 20 W

Tuesday Dec 28. 1854  
commences fine weather winds from  
SE steering to the South by the wind  
low squally winds and plenty of the  
yellow foam. no Whales yet  
but live in hopes of the morrow  
mid and latter fresh breezes from the  
East heading to the South by the  
wind
