Saturday Feb 7<sup>th</sup> 1858  
Commenced calm foggy fog lifted at  
4 P.M. saw two right whales heard  
fog shut down again took up the bales  
never saw the whales again mid and  
latter part light airs and calm  
thick fog Lat 40.48  
Long 56.04

Sunday Feb 8<sup>th</sup> 1858  
at Manidau the fog lifted wind from  
the west inclining to the South  
at night in sail steered ESE wind  
SE middle and latter part fine  
weather winds from SW steering  
SE Lat 41.39  
Long 55.04

Monday Feb 9<sup>th</sup> 1858  
fine weather winds from SW  
at Manidau steered ESE at night  
in sail as usual mid and latter  
fresh winds from the South  
heading to the East by the wind  
Lat 41.24  
Long 55.28

Tuesday Feb 10<sup>th</sup> 1858  
fresh winds from South head to  
East by the wind at 6 Long 52.28 at  
night in sail head to the East mid and  
latter part strong winds from  
SEW heading to the West by the  
wind Lat 41.40  
Long 52.01

Station off River S. Lapata

Wednesday Feb 11<sup>th</sup> 1858  
strong winds from SEW heading to  
the West at 8 in sail thick fog mid  
and latter part moderate and fine  
weather heading to the SEW  
Lat 41.36  
Long 53.11

Thursday Feb 12<sup>th</sup> 1858  
fine weather wind the Eastward  
one ship in sight thought to be  
the Emma of James mid and latter  
part light airs and calm at 10 AM hoisted  
and went on board the Emma of James  
Lat 41.09  
Long 53.14

Wednesday Feb 12<sup>th</sup> 1858  
fine weather winds from the NW  
mid and latter fresh winds from the  
SW inclining to the South heading  
on the the western tack  
Lat 40.49  
Long "

Saturday Feb 13<sup>th</sup> 1858  
fine weather wind from the South  
at 1 tacked to the East middle calm  
latter strong winds from SEW that  
the South at 9 tacked to the West  
the Emma in sight  
Lat 41.09  
Long 53.11
