Thursday March 10. 1858
light winds from S.W. heading to the
S.W. by the wind at night in day
head to the West. mid moderate latter
fine breeze from the South heading
to the N. at 10 sounded 85 fathoms
more ship to the S. S. S. 35. 57
Lang 53. 15

Friday March 11
strong breeze from the S.W. heading
to the S. E. the Emma C in sight
and one bark supposed to be the
Hoy at 3 P.M. Lang 2. 34
middle strong wind and heavy swell
at 10 midnight coast reefed main &
topsails latter more moderate
set the topsails and jibs
Lang 52. 30

Saturday March 12
fine weather wind from S.W.
at night in day head to the W
mid and latter part fine weather
nothing seen like whale
Lang 56. 29
Lang 58. 21

Sunday March 13
light winds from the West heading
to the South mid and latter pleasant
weather wind North by heading to
the Eastward by the wind
Lang 56. 46
Lang 52. 23

Station of River & Lapata

Monday March 14. 1858
light winds from the North at
Sunset double reefed the topsails
and tacked to the N.W. fine clear
weather for sailing but nothing to
be seen middle and latter part fine
weather winds from the North
at 9 bore a boat and went on board
the Clipper ship Eliza Harris 84 days
from Boston for San Francisco
Lang 56. 46
Lang 52. 23

Tuesday March 15
fine weather wind from the North
at night in day head to the S.W.
middle and latter part fresh wind
from the North heading to the W
Lang 56. 10
Lang 53. 26 at 2 P.M.

Wednesday March 16
fresh wind from the North at
10 sounded 65 fathoms more ship
to the East at night in day head to the
East middle and latter part fresh
winds from North at midday
tacked to the West Lang 56. 44
Lang 52. 56

Thursday March 17
strong winds from North at 6 in
day strong S.W. wind for the
maine banks and and after part
light winds from North strong S.W.
Lang 57. 11 Lang 52. 26
