Sunday April 4th 1858
 fresh winds from the South
 steering to the North nothing in
 sight mid and latter part moderate
 and fine weather winds West
 at 6 PM No bottom Lat 37. 21
 Long 55. 05

Monday April 5th
 fine weather mixed from the
 E & W found Current setting to the
 NW at night in Lake 56 fathoms
 mid and latter part fine weather
 wind from NW head to the SW
 Lat 37. 52 Long 56. 05
 Long 55. 41

Tuesday April 6th
 fresh winds from the NW at 8
 noon ship steamed out at 6 in
 Lake steamed SW by S mid and latter
 part fresh winds from the NW
 steamed SW by S saw one whale steering
 SW sounded 68 fathoms
 Lat 38. 54 Long 56. 00

Wednesday April 7th
 fine weather wind E & W steering
 Lake at 6 in Lake 50 fathoms Long
 56. 32 mid fresh winds from
 NW at 7 saw a Right whale head
 whale went to windward 96 fathoms
 Lat 40. 08 Long 57. 15

Station off River. L. Lapitata

Thursday April 8th 1858
 fresh winds from the North steamed in and
 off then the day saw nothing more at
 night in Lake head to the East 50 fathoms
 mid and latter moderate foggy at 6 5/8 fathoms
 head off East at meridians off in the
 rips no bottom head in thick fog
 Lat 40. 16 Long 56. 34

Friday April 9th
 light winds and thick fog head
 W by S at night in Lake 60 fathoms
 mid and latter part light winds from
 the North thick fog No Obs

Saturday April 10th
 light winds and thick fog 55 fathoms
 caught a good mess of fish mid and
 latter part light winds from the North
 thick fog No Observations

Sunday April 11th
 calm and thick fog employed fishing
 caught enough for a mess for all hands
 mid and latter part moderate and
 thick fog No Observations

Monday April 12th
 light winds from the North foggy
 made Lake steamed off at 2 3/8 fathoms
 saw ship headed in 3 hours back
 in Lake 55 fathoms mid and latter
 part moderate and thick fog
 No Observations
