

Remarks on Board Boat

Wednesday May 19 1858
Winds from West steering S.W. cloudy
weather mid and latter part very
specially much thunder and lightning
No observation

Thursday May 20th
all this day winds all round the
Campas same times calm at others
Blowing a Gale Lat 34. 49
Long 48. 21

Friday May 21st
Moderate winds and variable
very specially thunder and rain
Made and back in sail as occasion
Required middle specially rain
Calm & latter moderate breeze from
S.E. Lat 33. 06
Long 48. 59

Saturday May 22^d
winds from S.E. cloudy steering
S.W. & all sail drawing and trim
to the breeze mid strong winds latter
moderate wind North to S.W.
Lat 31. 30
Long 49. 10

Sunday May 23^d
light winds from N.W. at 6 turned
to the S.W. mid and latter fresh winds
from the N.W. Lat 31. 35
Long 48. 49

Station off River & Laplatas

Monday May 24th 1858
Strong winds from the N.W. back in
sail as the wind increased it is in favor to sail
headed to the East double reefed main & back
and fore sail mid strong gales from
the North latter part more moderate
wind inclining to the West
Lat 34. 46
Long 48. 10

Tuesday May 25th 1858
wind from S.W. cleared North heavy head
sea saw two brigs heading to the South
mid and latter part moderate steering
N.W. per Campos Lat 30. 55 by S.R.
Long 48. 11

Wednesday May 26th
light winds from the S.W. steering
N.W. at 5 spoke a Brazilian Brig
bound to Rio Janeiro mid and latter
part fresh winds from the S.W. steering
North at 4 steered N.W.
Lat 28. 37
Long 48. 20

Thursday May 27th
wind S.W. at meridian steered N.W.
at 2 saw the land at 4 saw the South
part of St. Catharines Island bent
the Chaves steered N.W. mid and
latter part moderate winds from the
South at 8 A.M. came in to the harbor
round the North End of the Island making
up to Anchorage
