Sunday July 11, 1858
 Strong winds from E. S. heading
 to the S. E. by the wind in place
 Repairing sails, masts and other
 part strong winds from the East saw
 a large Spanish ship heading to the South
 by the wind Lat. 20. " 18
 Long. 80. " 25

Monday July 11th
Fresh winds and squally at 6 tacked to
the S.E. middle and latter part strong
winds from the East Sun squally
the land 20 miles off
Lat 20 39

Tuesday July 18th
Strong winds from the East at 6
Singly. Ripped the topsails tacked
to the N.E. fore and barceing it.
Mid and latter part fresh winds and
sporadic Rain B.C. The fore and W. wind
off. Barceing etc.

Wednesday July 27th
Squally Rain & C at slight bladed off
South. Duhle Reefed Carried up mid
and latter part strong winds and squally
at 9 sent three boats in after humpback
and lined out. Part. caught a Good Mesh of
fish at 10 P.M. Carried on board
back up the Boats

Stationery & Envelopes

Thursday July 11th 1888
Commenced rain moderate at night wind
off to the S.W. by the wind middle of night
fine weather at 8 desert the boats in at
10 struck a Hampshire shot a Burn lance
in to one of the big ones killed. Led at
latter part of fine weather dis. two sails
to end

St. Michael July 16th
fine weather at 8 P.M. with the wind
& the ship drew the boats from the
other side him commenced cutting for
the head gear, in lashed down for the night
seems heavy at daylight cut in the body
at 8 finished and the app was 12 miles
calm down ends

Saturday July 17th
Calm in forenoon. Learning and cutting
up the Pelukin. at 10 commenced
boiling and put light in hand and
at 8 set the boats in shade plenty
of Humphreys. Bad smell as usual

Monday July 18th
Heavy swell. Light wind at 6 p.m. started
Boatmen at 6 the boats returned
without success mid. and latter part
moderate and squally washed off the
decks and drove the oil that leaked
and got dinner
