

Sunday Sept 3rd 1858
Light winds from the N.E. at 6.00 AM
W.S.W. freshened the light eases mid and
latter part moderate and cloudy with
steering W.S.W. wind till Rain 8.0
No Abs Lang 40.00

Monday Sept 4th
fresh winds from S.E. steering
W.S.W. Rain at 4 P.M. Lang 40.16 by 8.0
mid and latter part strong winds
from S.E. at 3 A.M. double reefed strong
squalls and lots of rain
Lat 24.52 Long 42.00

Tuesday Sept 5th
strong winds from S.E. cloudy at
3 began to break up at night quite
clear mid and latter fine breezes from
the N.E. steering W.S.W. do ends
Lat 25.35 Long 44.38

Wednesday Sept 6th
fresh winds from the N.E. at midday
the Eclipse of the Sun began to go off
had been on about 1 hour. Moon nearly
all covered mid and latter part fine
weather steering W.S.W. do ends
Lat 26.26 Long 47.02

Thursday Sept 7th
light winds from the N.E. steering
W.S.W. pleasant weather mid and latter
part finer weather at daylight the
land in sight Alvarado head in for the
passage to the North of the island

Friday Sept 8th 1858
commenced fine weather winds from
the North at 4 P.M. came to anchor
in 6 fathoms to the south of the fort
at 8 AM left the ship for the coast
at 9 arrived there and entered the ship
do ends

Saturday Sept 9th
fine weather wind southerly at 4 P.M.
left the Cita for the ship at 6 P.M.
Board at 7 sent in a raft for water
field and took it on Board
do ends

Sunday Sept 10th
dew. Rain wind from South in night
steering away water at night set the
march at daylight called all hands
got breakfast then started march
went on shore at night came on
Board employed getting water off

Monday Sept 11th
variable winds and weather employed
getting water do ends

Tuesday Sept 12th
winds N.E. thick sun squally all
hands employed in getting off water
do ends

Wednesday Sept 13th
wind N.E. squally took a Reft a
long side at 11 took it in slaved it
in the fore hold
