

Tuesday Oct 14 1858

Fresh winds from the North starting South by West employed painting boats and other jobs about the ship nothing in sight mid and latter part fresh winds from the North clearing sky & calm.

Wednesday Oct 15

Moderate winds from North same Rain at 5 PM wind started to the SW & Clear off heading to the SE by the wind. Double reefed middle strong gales from West high sea shipped and stove the starboard beam boat did some damage to the Gally but soon repaired by her & the South board reefed main & sail stay sail and spencer.

Thursday Oct 16

Strong gales from the West set by head to the South high sea at 4 PM wind halled to the SW wave ship to the NW equally so ends

Friday Oct 17

Strong winds from the SW at 4 set the fore sail more moderate mid and latter part strong winds from heading to the West at 10 set the fore & top sail and bark in sight

Saturday Oct 16 1858

Strong winds from the South heading to the West under double reefed topsails employed mending boats mid and latter part moderate fine weather at 10 landed for what we called sperm whales but they went out of sight to the SW. saw one whale before we came on board

Sunday Oct 17 1858

Fine weather at 3 took up the boats at 6 saw three Right Whale heading to the off to get their before dark took in. saw head to the South wind SE middle fine weather at 6 saw Right whales landed but not fasten at 7 took up the boats at 8 landed and fasten to two whale got them both

Monday Oct 18

light winds and fine weather at 1 PM took one of the whales got up the tables at 3 took the other whale got dinner commenced cutting finished and kept the other until morning at 5 hooked the other cut him in began Bailing

Tuesday Oct 19 Sett 34. 43 Tuesday Oct 19 fine weather at 5 landed for an eight whale drove him off plenty of finbacks mid and latter part light winds and calm Bailing salt lots of finbacks
