

Wednesday Oct 20 1858
light air from the S.E. had my
7 AM off the side in sight at 6
in sail and set the mack mid and latter
part moderate and fine weather Bailing
S.E. no whales in sight
Sett 35. 16 Long 53. 38

Thursday Oct 21
fine weather employed Bailing at 4
PM went on board of Spanish Brig
of war bound to Montevideo mid and
latter part moderate sea spread
light rain spoke an English Brig
from Panama
the English man saw whales in. Sett 35. 40 Long 53. 25

Friday Oct 22
moderate breeze from the south employed
Bailing out the main hatch & stow out
at night in sail strong breeze from
SE heading SW at 11 finished Bailing
latter part strong winds from SE
stowing oil in the main hatch.
Sett 35. 13 Long 51. 21

Saturday Oct 23
strong winds from S.E. employed
head to the south employed
stowing oil in the main
macks mid and latter part moderate
winds from the east.
at 11 saw Right Whales
saw and drove him off
Sett 35. 22 Long 52. 36

Saturday Oct 24 1858
moderate winds from the East high swell
at 3 saw four whales struck one at 4
& PM took him to the ship made him
well fast for the night at 5 commenced
cutting very bad swell kept the ship
before the wind at morning finished
Sett 35. 46 Long 53. 00

Sunday Oct 25
strong winds from S.E. cloudy sent
down the cables and cleared the decks
looked so much like rain put on
the hatches until morning mid 8
latter part strong Gale with rain
wind S.E. had to the S.E.
No whales

Monday Oct 26
strong Gale from S.E. Rain wind
heaved gradually to the south
mid and latter part the same
strong Gale wind hawling to the SW
and on SW ship heading NW.
No whales

Tuesday Oct 27
strong Gale but no rain at 8 PM
commenced Bailing very high sea
middle more moderate latter increased
again thick and some foggy & end
No whales

Wednesday Oct 28
strong Gale from SW very bad sea
still Bailing mid and latter part more
moderate set the fore topail close
Kept to try to steady the ship & end
Sett 36. 22
