

Thursday Oct 29 1858
wind from SW high sea running well
bailing lead to the west mid and latter
part moderate cloudy wind to the south
from that to SE employed stowing
oil in the main hatch
Lat 36° 10'

Friday Oct 30
moderate winds from the SE stowing
oil at 6 sounded no bottom
middle fine weather at 10 sounded 45
fathoms have too head to the SW
head yards aback at 4 saw whales
beyond found them wild at 11 struck
and killed one so ends
Lat 35° 26' Long 12° 09'
45 fathoms

Saturday Oct 31
fine weather at 1 took the whale
to the ship got dinner stowed down
the oil commenced cutting & finished
set the wash cleared the decks &c
Lat 35° 13' Long 12° 14'

Sunday Nov 1
fine weather and light winds from
SW & NW at 6 sounded 45 fathoms
moderate and fine weather employed
bailing at 11 sounded 45 fathoms
Lat 35° 20'

Monday Nov 2 1858
fine weather at 3 saw whales beyond
caught one at 4 PM took him to
the ship made him well fast for
the night employed bailing
mid and latter part calm at 7 comm
enced cutting at 11 finished
Lat 35° 26' 55 fathoms water.

Tuesday Nov 3
calm employed bailing two salves
light middle calm and light winds latter
winds from SW at 4 towards sea light
whales did not fasten at 10 took
a heavy gale from the SW that is
all sail here to head to the SE calm and
a strong gale started bailing
No lbs

Wednesday Nov 4
strong gale from the SW had sea
on lay head to the SE all things well secured
for the night mid and latter part heavy
gales from the SW lay head to the
South
Lat 36° 16'

Thursday Nov 5
heavy gales and bad sea mid
the same latter part more moderate
Lat 36° 30'

Friday Nov 6
strong winds from the SW at
mariner commenced bailing at 7
set the fore sail more to the SE
mid and latter part moderate calm &c
stowing oil Lat 36° 13' Long 11° 12'
