 Commences moderate and calm thick
 fog at 8 finished bedding at 4 finished
 stowing all the cold air sleeping with
 chest kept main & sail and fore sail
 middle part fresh breezes from N
 at midnight descended to 5 fathoms looped
 the head to the North thick weather
 at 10 a strong Gale Rain at 10 took
 in fore sail at midnight finished
 stowing the sail saw three whales
 No other

Monday Nov 15
 Strong Gale and Rain by head
 to the S.E. middle and latter part
 foggy and calm heavy swell Barometer
 falling so ends No other

Tuesday Nov 16
 calm foggy and heavy swell mid
 & heavy Gale from S.W. latter more
 moderate by head to the West
 salt 35.32 day 52.04

Wednesday Nov 17
 strong wind from the S.W. at 4 set
 the fore sail down to 5 fathoms
 main ship to the S.E. mid and latter
 part calm and light air saw
 ship taken a whale at 6 spoke
 the ship proved to be the Atlantic
 3 months from N.B.

Thursday Nov 18 1858
 moderate fine weather mid and latter
 part fine fresh breezes at 9 spoke
 the Emma C. James got letters and many
 other things that made my heart rejoice
 salt 35.26 40 fathoms

Friday Nov 19
 commences fine weather mid and latter
 the North drizzle in company
 with Emma C at 3 P.M. saw a whale
 bored and caught him mid and
 latter part foggy thunder Rain S.E.
 at 8 Am 37 fathoms

Saturday Nov 20
 moderate variable. Wind same foggy
 middle and latter part fresh wind
 employed looking for the whales
 salt 35.23 " 57 fathoms

Sunday Nov 21
 fine weather with a strong breeze
 at 2 bore a whale lying much
 chased could not come up at 4 saw
 one more and caught him at 6
 took him to the ship at 8 finished
 cutting mid and latter moderate down
 slightly at 10 saw boarded the American
 ship of War the Hancock from
 Rio Jan. Martineau
 employed bailing so ends
 at 8 descended got in the
