

Monday Nov 14th 1858
Cloudy same Rain at 8 fine weather
employed Bailing several sail in
light middle and latter part
fine weather employed Bailing
Sail 35.35 Long 12.35
45 fathoms.

Tuesday Nov 15th
fine weather wind from the North
at 4 took a signal from the S.W.
thunder Rain and Wind stopped
Bailing in all sail at 11 commenced
again latter part heavy Gale from
S.W. at Meridian finished Bailing
Sail 35.35. 69 fathoms

Wednesday Nov 16th
heavy Gales from the S.W.
high Sea in middle more moderate
latter calm employed stowing
ail in the fore hold
Sail 35. 02 in the morning
45 fathoms

Steamed South then the day
Going 3 knots at 6 PM 80 fathoms

Thursday Nov 17th
fine weather wind from the
North steering South at night
in sail steamed on middle fine
weather later latter the same at
8 lowered fore Right 4 knots Steamed
and till one at Meridian took
him to the ship to end
Sail 35.35. 75 fathoms
when we had son cutting at night 8 PM

Friday Nov 18th 1858
fine fresh wind from the North
at 1 commenced Bailing at 5 finished
Got supper and set the watch mid and
latter part strong winds from the North
thick smoke employed Bailing
Sail 1 whole (Sail 35.39 70 fathoms)

Saturday Nov 19th
Strong winds thick at 1 spoke the
Huntress 14 months ago mid and
latter part fresh winds and thick fog
No Alas

Sunday Nov 20th
commenced moderate and foggy mid
and latter fine weather saw no sails
but saw the Huntress the same
at Meridian spoke the Command of
H.M. Bedford 50 days out Clear
Sail 35.39 60 fathoms

Monday Nov 21st
fine weather employed stowing ail
in the fore hold no whole this
day mid and latter part thick fog
stowing ail in the fore hold
No Alas 58 fathoms

Tuesday Nov 22nd
thick fog all the fore 14 fathoms sun
to the S.W. about 15 miles then saw
two short sail at 6 PM 35 fathoms
headed off to the East
No Alas
