Sunday Dec 15
strong gales from south head 8.00
at 6 calm ship head 8.00 E
at 4 PM Langitua 53. 30. West
mid and latter part strong winds from
the south fine weather in the morning
saw 35 " 50 } 35 fathoms
made off 25 miles
descended got no
bottom

Monday Dec 16
fine weather light winds from the
south at 6 calm mid moderate steamed
W.S.W. thru the night at 4 steamed W.S.W.
improved steaming down strong winds from
north nothing in sight but ships
saw 36 " 15 " 40 fathoms

Tuesday Dec 17
strong winds from the north nothing
in sight but ships mid and latter
part strong winds from the north head
by the wind to the W.S.W. in the morning
No Bottom at 80 fathoms
saw 37 " 04 Lang. 54 " 09

Wednesday Dec 18
fine weather wind N.W. 4 miles in sight
at night in lake head to the west mid and
latter the weather 4 miles saw the cleane
take a whale saw the India strike and
saw 37 " 65 Lang. 17 " 00 fathoms
