moderate and thick weather at 10
spoke the Leonidas one whale
at the same time the Ohio
1 whale Lat 38. 45
Long 53 40

Friday Dec 31 1858
fine weather winds from the south
mid and latter part the same down thick
the Ohio in sight
Lat 38. 38 Long 55. 55

Saturday Jan 1 1859
moderate and thick weather mid
and latter part calm
Lat 38. 15 Long 55. 53

Sunday Jan 2 1859
calm the Ohio in sight 1 mile off
at night in Sale mid and latter part
moderate foggy at 1 noon ship to the SE
Lat 37. 39 Long 55. 27

Monday Jan 3
fine part fresh winds from the NW
at 9 mine SW clear strong breeze, bubble
reefed at night in Sale true Sale in
sight mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather at 11 AM spoke the
Huntress and Ohio sea no whales
Lat 36. 49 Long 55. 30

Tuesday Jan 4
calm fine weather in company
with the Huntress and Ohio
at night bubble reefed
mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather steamed to the
Eastward Lat 36. 29
Long 51. 53
