moderate pleasant weather nothing in  
sight  
Lat 37° 01' Long 54° 33'

Wednesday March 13<sup>th</sup>  
fine weather wind from NE light  
airs at night in sail heading NW  
mid and latter part fine weather  
light airs from the ENE  
Lat 37° 39' Long 54° 37'

Thursday March 14<sup>th</sup>  
light winds from the East at  
4 P.M. spoke the Catherine  
from New London clear  
mid and latter part foggy winds from  
the North  
Long 55° 74'

Friday March 15<sup>th</sup>  
fresh winds from North thick weather  
heading to the West at night in sail  
mid and latter part fine  
weather light airs from the  
North steering S by E  
Lat 38° 38' Long 55° 55'

Saturday March 16<sup>th</sup> 1859  
fine weather light winds from  
the North steering S by E at  
night in sail caught plenty of fish  
48 fathoms station mid and latter  
part moderate fine weather light airs  
from the North  
Lat 39° 40' Long 56° 56'

Sunday March 17<sup>th</sup>  
fine weather light airs from the  
South heading East by the wind at night  
in sail mid and latter part moderate  
and foggy No observation

Monday March 18<sup>th</sup>  
light winds from the East thick fog  
it is in sail calm southerly East by  
North mid and latter part moderate  
winds and thick fog to End

Tuesday March 19<sup>th</sup>  
light winds from the East thick  
fog lying head to the West at sail in  
mid and latter part moderate calm thick  
fog 80

Wednesday March 20<sup>th</sup>  
thick fog light airs at 3 fog lighted  
made sail spoke the Able had seen  
no whales at late at night in sail all  
usual mid and latter part moderate  
mild and pleasant two ships in  
sight  
Lat 40° 05' Long 54° 50'
