

Thursday March 17 1859
 Light winds from the N.E. heading
 at night in sail plenty of
 birds & fish but no whales
 mid and latter part moderate and
 foggy. No observations

Friday March 18
 fresh winds from the North thick
 fog lying head to the west caught
 at 10. mid and latter part foggy
 at 10. mid sail steered to the East
 catching a few salt 40" 15"
 long 55" 18"

Saturday March 19
 Moderate winds from the North
 at night in sail steered South by E.
 mid and latter part calm light air
 thick fog when mid it became clear
 weather

Sunday March 20
 Thick fog Calm. No mid and
 latter part moderate more clear
 salt 41" 14 6 long 56 as

Monday March 21
 heading S.W. by W. mid North
 at 10 thick fog in sail head to N
 mid and latter fresh winds and
 thick fog. No observations

Tuesday March 22
 light air and calm foggy & C
 mid and latter part moderate
 at times a little more clear the
 mast at the time dense fog
 long 57" 08. 60 fathoms

Wednesday March 23 1859
 light winds from the N.E. thick
 weather heading in shore at night
 in sail caught some fish mid and
 latter light air calm & caught lots of
 fish salt 41" 15" long 57" 30
 45 fathoms

Thursday March 24
 Calm thick fog has much longer
 is this fog to last mid and latter
 part moderate winds from the East
 thick fog

Friday March 25
 strong winds from the East & East
 thick fog at 3 o'clock kept the main &
 sail took in spanker and jib at 5
 took in fore sail lay head to the S.E.
 mid and latter part winds from
 the N.E. thick weather
 No observations

Saturday March 26
 strong winds from the N.E. at 6
 took up the boats on the upper crane
 wind westerly rain mid and latter
 strong winds and thick from North &
 East at meridian wind S.E. barometer
 down

Sunday March 27
 strong gales from S.E. at 4. made ship to
 the East & ship layed head at 6. more again
 heavy gails from S.E. rain at midnight
 more moderate latter a strong breeze from
 S.W. heading N.W. by W. bubble Raged
 salt 44" 14 8
